

Because this is an office building, we require some very strict rules and regulations. This is to keep your children safe, and to keep Wally's Play Groups safe and able to continue its practice in the building. We are truly sorry that we are not located in a more child friendly location, and really appreciate your strict adherence to these rules.

Building Rules

- All children must be accompanied by an adult at all times
- Children are required to use walking feet and inside voices in the building, outside on the stairs, and around the busy parking lot area (i.e. no running, chasing, yelling – and please be careful of the new bike lane! It makes us nervous because even we forget to look before we cross sometimes!)
- Please respect the building property
- Please park and walk your child to Suite #312 and wait there until we can greet you. I know it's tempting with the older kids, but we cannot allow you to drop your child off in the lobby or at the front steps.

Before - Bathrooms

- Please accompany your child to the bathroom before group starts. For safety reasons, Karrin cannot leave the group to take a child to the bathroom, and she cannot allow any children to go alone. The key to the bathroom is attached to a kitchen utensil hooked on the cork board in Suite #312.

During

- Because the small waiting room in #312 is shared with another provider, we ask that parents go down to the main lobby once group gets started, rather than staying upstairs.

After – Conference room

- When group is over, Karrin will bring the children down to the conference room. She will give a very brief summary of what they did during group that day and then will need to rush off to clean up her room and prepare for the next group coming in. The time between groups is very short, unfortunately, which means there will be no time to answer even the quickest of questions.
